Harrow Beijing

Harrow Beijing was founded in 2005, with the clear brief to provide high quality British based education and preparation for leading universities around the world. Currently, there are over 1,300 students and 21 different nationalities attending the School.

Our Campuses

Harrow Beijing offers a world-class, purpose-built campus that provides an exceptional environment for teaching and learning.

Alongside modern, well-equipped classrooms, the campus features a 20,000sqm library, a multi-purpose theatre, two 'black box' drama areas, and a music centre complete with a recording studio. Teachers also benefit from outstanding sports facilities, including a 25m swimming pool, a 2,220sqm air-conditioned gymnasium for badminton, volleyball, and basketball, a dance studio, a top-rope climbing wall, tennis courts, and floodlit sports pitches.

Specialist learning zones for Art, Music, and Drama, a computing suite, and outdoor play

areas further support a rich and dynamic curriculum. Our flexible creative spaces encourage innovation, collaboration, and holistic development.







Our Educational Philosophy

Harrow Beijing is known for its commitment to academic excellence and for the way each student is supported through personal tutoring with dedicated staff members. Our mission statement of 'Educational excellence for life and leadership' is implemented through the skills students develop when studying our wide and varied curriculum and further evidenced through our co-curricular enrichment programmes.

Students participate in a wide selection of Leadership & Service Activities of their choice. Activities designed to enrich the academic curriculum as part of our holistic approach. Whether a student wishes to explore maths in a new and exciting way through a problem solving LSA, wants to try out playing on a football team for fun, or learn a new skill such

as public speaking via LAMDA, we aim to offer our students every opportunity to try something new or extend their current skills. As well as a large variety of sports. We also attend the international tournaments with ISAC, ACAMIS and FOBISIA.

The House System is an integral part of school life and is modelled on the Houses of Harrow School. The school is divided into six Houses. Churchill, Kong Zi, John Lyon, Song Qing Ling, Curie and Ju Ching Chu. All students belong to one House, where they can build rapport with peers within the supportive environment of the Harrow community. The personalised experience is central to our students' wellbeing and personal development as they journey through their school career and progress into life beyond school.

Our Students and Staff

The overwhelming majority of Harrow Beijing students win places at their university of first choice such as Oxford, Cambridge, Durham, Exeter, Imperial, LSE, Warwick, University College London, and King's College London in the UK, and Yale, Cornell, Columbia, UCLA in the USA.

Students and staff enjoy a positive working environment which is well resourced and characterized by high levels of commitment and goodwill. Sharing the same values and mission as all of the schools within the Harrow group, there is a strong sense of community and the confidence that all are well supported. One of the best features of Harrow Beijing is the support that all staff and students give so readily which makes for a very dynamic and positive school.



Our Curriculum And Bilingual Education



At the heart of Harrow's educational philosophy are the development of the mind and an understanding of how an individual student learns best. The intellectual, social and ethical needs of our students determine our educational requirements. In its curriculum development, always an on-going process, Harrow Beijing is forward thinking and innovative. We believe in a curriculum that has its foundations in intellectual content rather than assessment, important though that is. We aim to equip our students to think, appreciate and create, while always having the opportunity to excel.

The Harrow curriculum consists of two distinct yet complementary strands, both of which seek to promote individual excellence and achievement. The examined curriculum guides the academic structure in both the Senior and Prep sections of the school; the focus being

successful preparation of students for both IGCSE and A-level public examinations. In our selection of courses, we aim to provide subject material that will inspire students of all ages. The curriculum as a whole is well-balanced and provides the breadth to contribute effectively to students' academic and social attainment. Harrow Beijing aims to broaden the intellectual horizons of our students further through the non-examined part of the curriculum. Here we provide access to essential learning opportunities which may not otherwise be accessible to students in regular academic lesson time.

Our Uniquely Innovative Approach:

The academic model has been carefully crafted so that it harnesses the strength and rigour of education in China and instills a deep understanding of Chinese heritage, culture, tradition and language. An innovative approach to pedagogy and pastoral care ensures pupils learn in a manner that promotes the Harrow values, leadership attributes and holistic approach to education synonymous with Harrow School in the UK and all our other schools across the globe.

The curriculum expertly sequences knowledge and skills progression appropriate to each child's age and stage of development – students are supported and stretched as needed.

Expert native language teaching ensures the development of bilingualism so that pupils have the social, cultural and technical language to thrive in China and beyond.

Our Chinese curriculum for Grades 1 to Grade 9 is committed to ensuring excellence in delivery of the Chinese National Compulsory Education Curriculum, combining this with our unique Harrow approach to holistic education – preparing students to excel academically and to succeed as global citizens.

Exclusively designed by senior education experts, the curriculum blends the best of East and West. Students have the opportunity to sit a number of GCSEs based on their blended journey in Year 11 which allows for A-level study in the 6th Form.

Students transition to the sixth form confident in both Chinese and English, well prepared academically and socially for entry to the very best universities globally. This approach, a first in China, ensures that students benefit from a world-class education which blends academic excellence with preparation for life and leadership.



Harrow Beijing International Curriculum

The Harrow Beijing international curriculum is rooted in the English National Curriculum, but a vital focus is also given to the international dimension of the school. We never lose sight of the fact that we are a school in China and celebrate our host culture whenever possible.

Education at Harrow Beijing is a continual process of discovering, learning and maturing, as students-supported by their teachers and their parents-progress through the various key stages of their school life. Probably our greatest challenge as a school is to develop in our students the capacity for independent thought and action, and then combine this with rational and responsible decision-making.

We appreciate the value of many traditional teaching methods and we employ them with skill and enthusiasm, but we also believe that lessons are best taught when students are actively involved in a dynamic process of thinking, discovering, and understanding things for themselves. The way students learn is just as important as the way teachers teach. We therefore place an emphasis on interactive and co-operative learning, devising lessons that draw on the different knowledge, aptitudes and learning styles of individual students.

Classes are kept to appropriate size and, as a result, each student receives the individual attention from the teacher that is essential in ensuring that necessary progress is made. The facilities and resources available support our educational philosophy at all junctures.







Early Years (Pre-nursery - Year 1)

Our kindergarten students adopts the EYAHC which encourages students to be curious, independent and happy. Children are able to develop creative thinking and essential life skills through an exciting, individualised curriculum that recognises that every child is unique. Children also benefit from lessons by specialists in Physical Education, Music, and Languages.

Pre-Prep Phase (Years 2-5)

In Pre-Prep, children continue to develop essential literacy, numeracy and computing skills. Emphasis is placed on the enjoyment of books and the teaching of reading and writing along with Mathematics and Coding. As they progress through Pre Prep, children are introduced to more specialist subjects in Languages, Music, Physical Education, Computing, Art and Design Technology and Science.

Prep Phase (Years 6-8)

Modelled on the best practices of British Preparatory Schools and international Middle Schools, our Prep Phase is a blend of specialist-taught core subjects such as English, Mandarin, Mathematics, Science and Coding, with additional subjects taught including; Art, Drama, Design Technology, Geography, History, Music and Physical Education. Students in Y6-8 focus on a broad and balanced "Prep" education. This leads to a wider range of options for GCSE and beyond into A-level.

The Senior Phase (Years 9-11)

Designed to build on the knowledge and skills developed in the Prep Phase, our Senior School curriculum is increasingly academically demanding, focusing students on national and international public examinations. Building towards their IGCSE examinations (usually taken in Year 11), students are intellectually stretched. Subjects taught include: Art, Biology, Chemistry, Computing, Design Technology, Drama, English, Geography, History, Languages, Mathematics, Physics, Physical Education, Music, Economics, Media, Mandarin and Business Studies.

The Sixth Form (Years 12 and 13)

Following IGCSE examinations, students move into the 'Sixth Form' Phase of the School and prepare themselves for success at University. They complete a two-year suite of A-Level courses, that are regarded as the gold standard of the British education system and recognised worldwide for university entrance. The Sixth Form years are both challenging and exciting. Students have the opportunity to specialise in subjects they particularly excel at and study these areas to an advanced academic level. Many students complete an 'Extended Project Qualification' (EPQ) which allows for the development of research skills and the exploration of a topic of special interest in even greater depth. Students also have an opportunity to contribute to the management and leadership of the school by taking on key student positions of responsibility such as Prefect, Senior Prefect, Head Girl, Head Boy, Student Academic Leadership Team and the Student Council.

Living and Working In Beijing

Beijing (北京) means 'Northern Capital' and as suggested is the capital city of China and currently home to roughly 21 million inhabitants. It is the cultural and political centre of China, home to a world record seven UNESCO World Heritage sites as well as the seat of China's government.

Beijing is an exciting city with a cultural mix of historical sites, modern museums and art exhibitions, and a vibrant business district and expat area. Mixed throughout the city are a multitude of green parks, sports venues (including Olympic parks now used by the public), and the cultural footprint of the 'hutongs', Beijing's historic courtyard residences, many of which have been transformed into modern residential apartments.

A hop, step and jump from the bustling capital lie countless world-renowned attractions such as the Great Wall, Forbidden City, Summer Palace and Temple of Heaven, to mention only a few, while those looking for the modern shopping life are spoiled for choice with an array of vast shopping malls housing some of the world's largest brands. In the centre of the city is the Sanlitun shopping district which doubles as a popular expat community area and home to some of the city's most visited bars, coffee shops, clubs and restaurants, including multiple Michelin starred establishments.

Beijing has a monsoon-influenced, continental climate, characterized by hot summers (temperatures hover in the high 30s for long periods) and cold, dry winters, falling as low as -20s in the coldest periods. Spring and Autumn are seasons of transition and relatively short with rapid cooling and warming periods leading into the longer winters and summers. Rain is relatively rare across the year, with snow even rarer. Meanwhile, the air quality – once a real downside of life in China – has seen a huge change in recent years, with clear blue skies and low AQI days a regular occurrence across the city.

Getting around the city couldn't be easier, helped in no small part by Beijing's vast



subway network which joins almost everywhere you would need to visit (including the subway station just a few minutes walk from school, making commuting to work very easy). The city is also served by multiple taxi apps, a famous bicycle network, and endless bus routes. All of these are supported by mobile applications which are easy to access for expats. There are two major airports at opposite corners of the city (Beijing Capital and Daxing international airports) as well as four major rail stations which serve everincreasing areas of China.

For those wishing to explore the vast options available, there are a huge range of tour companies who offer very high-quality and cost-effective options for day trips and longer excursions within both the confines of Beijing province and China generally. Many staff enjoy 'staycations' both in the centre of the city and in the countryside surrounding the urban area. but the joys of the rest of the China are viable throughout the year, including the beach resorts of Sanya and Xiamen, the outstanding natural wonders of Guilin, Dali and Chengdu, Harbin's ice city, and culturally significant areas a little further from the capital such as Tibet and Xinjiang. Countries such as Thailand, Vietnam, Japan, Indonesia, and Malaysia short flights away, the world is your oyster!

Functioning in Beijing relies heavily on mobile applications, with WeChat and Alipay dominating the digital payment markets, also having multifunctional capabilities to allow for taxi booking, home delivery, utilities payment, bicycle unlocking and almost everything else you can think of. Taobao functions as China's mix of eBay and Amazon, while there are a multitude of grocery and fast food applications, including several Englishlanguage options. While a translation app will be very useful, especially at first, both WeChat and Alipay have advanced translation tools built in which are invaluable.

Accommodation options are vast in Beijing. New employees are required to live onsite in the first year and may opt to move out in the second year. Wherever you choose to live, we have a dedicated team in school who will help you with apartment viewings, contract negotiations and then the formal agreements and paperwork. In addition to these administrative requirements, the HR team will also support you every step of the way with work permits, visas and other official steps needed as part of living here. If you accept a role with Harrow Beijing, both HR and the Harrow community in general will support you every step of the way with preparation for travel to China through our 'buddy' system.

- 100% remission on tuition fees for up to two (2) dependent children attending the School. Starting from 3 rd child, 50% remission on tuition fees.
- For teaching couples (both teaching in Harrow) 100% remission on tuition fees for up to three (3) dependent children attending the school. Starting from 4th child, 50% remission on tuition fees.
- The cost of all working visas, dependents' resident visas, medical checks, non-criminal checks, and work permits cost are paid for by the school but subject to individual income tax.
